



## Year 11 Prom Passport

As in previous years, we intend to hold our annual 'Prom' to celebrate the end of the Year 11 students' time at Lathom High and as something for them to look forward to after all their hard work in exams.

We would encourage students to regard the 'Prom' as a celebration of their hard work, having given as good an account of themselves as possible during Year 11 and in their GCSE examinations. Success at GCSE can best be achieved by studying both at home and especially by the guided programmes of revision that are led by the staff in the time approaching the examinations.

This year Lathom High School will be running a Year 11 'Passport to the Prom'. The 'Passport to the Prom' will recognise and reward the achievements and efforts that each Year 11 student continues to make during their time at Lathom High School by giving them the opportunity to take part in this special event.

The "Passport to the Prom" will run from Monday 15 January 2018

Criteria for admission to the Prom is as follows:

- Show respect to all staff at all times.
- Have 97% or above attendance from 15 January onwards. (A valid medical reason for poor attendance will be considered by the Senior Leadership Team).
- Attend Year 11 parents evening on 8 February or make alternative arrangements to discuss performance in the mocks.
- Attend intervention sessions as directed. These may be held after school, at lunch time and during the half term breaks.
- Have 100% of any controlled assessment completed and handed in to the subject teacher within subject deadlines.
- Demonstrate exemplary behaviour, especially during the trial and external exam period.
- Attend all exam preparation sessions in school time as directed.  
Have no more than 2 after school detentions from 15<sup>th</sup> January onwards.
- The vast majority of ATL (Attitude to Learning) on the school report is good or better.

The Year 11 Prom is a prestigious event and an opportunity for students to celebrate their time at Lathom High School, but it is important at this point to stress that attendance at the Prom is a reward and by no means a right.

The 'passport' seeks to provide students with a structure to help ensure they achieve their academic potential by encouragement and reward and allows us to formally recognise their efforts, excellent behaviour, achievements and all round performance.
